Pastor, Jesse Sternke Cell Phone: 507-370-3368 "Now if the ministry of death, carved in letters on stone, came with such glory that the Israelites could not gaze at Moses' face because of its glory, which was being brought to an end, will not the ministry of the Spirit have even more glory? For if there was glory in the ministry of condemnation, the ministry of righteousness must far exceed it in glory." – 2 Corinthians 3:7-9

When you are alone, what does your mind most often become preoccupied with? What do you tend to daydream about? What do you care most about? What animates you the most? Energizes you the most? Captivates you the most? Stirs and inspires and motivates you the most? What—based on your daily life and the things you love to talk about—would other people say is the most important thing to you? Whatever answer is most common among these questions is what we worship. The hope is—the goal we pursue—is that the answer is God.

Worshiping God is to glorify Him. Last month, I talked about the Hebrew word for glory—"kavod"—and how it meant "heavy, weighty, or burdensome." When we come into the New Testament, the meaning of the word "glory" changes. From the Greek word "doxa," glory means "brightness, an especially divine quality, the unspoken manifestation of God, splendor." How different that is from the Hebrew word "kavod!" The glory of God went from being a responsibility we bear—though it still is that—to a freedom we enjoy.

We see this in the verses above. Paul shares how the glory of God affected Moses and the Israelites. A veil had to cover Moses' face because the people could not bear the awesome splendor of God's glory. But because of Christ's work on the cross and the new covenant of grace that He instituted, our interaction with God's glory changed. The early Christians understood that a weight was being lifted off of them and that there was freedom. Their worship turned from a fearful humility to a bold humility—although, it was still humility. But the boldness isn't out of pride but out of faith. It comes from an assured hope that Christ has made a way to come to God. The veil has been lifted and the burden that Christ offers us is easy and light. Even though it is still a burden, we partake of it in confidence and in joy.

Glorifying God is still an act of humility. It is still coming low before Him as He is lifted up. But we no longer feel the weight of glory in the same way we once did. Under the old covenant, God's glory was burdensome because of our sin. But through Christ, there is a greater glory—one marked by freedom. Paul goes on to say in 2 Corinthians 3:17, "Now the Lord is the Spirit, and where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is freedom." This is what Christ gives us through His sacrifice.

This article and last month's article is a brief theological foundation of what it means to glorify God. But let's not hesitate to put this into practice. Be encouraged to participate in worship this month in a spirit of joy and freedom. Come before God with thanksgiving in your heart and enter His courts with praise. This is what He desires for us.
