"Put to death therefore what is earthly in you: sexual immorality, impurity, passion, evil desire, and covetousness, which is idolatry. On account of these the wrath of God is coming." – Colossians 3:5-6

I used to volunteer as a chaplain at a couple of hospitals down in Tennessee. One hospital was similar to Avera in Rock Rapids and the other one was more akin to Sanford in Sioux Falls. Some of the rooms that I walked into required special protective wear. I'd have to wash my hands, put on a gown, gloves, and mask. Sometimes, I had to wear a face shield depending on the patient. To leave the room, everything had to be discarded and I had to thoroughly wash my hands. I couldn't hang onto that equipment. It was contaminated and had to be discarded.

As we've focused on equipping ourselves to serve God, there is one aspect that we've left out—our need to discard the tools that are bad and broken. The tools we need to do this with is our sin nature. Prior to coming to Christ, we learned how to cope with life, find strength to meet the challenges of the day, motivate ourselves, connect with people, and more. While we may view some of those tools as good, we need to realize that they are all tinged with sin and need to be cleansed and transformed through Christ. And some of those tools are all together corrupt and need to be thrown away.

We see this in Colossians as Paul shares the difference between our old and new selves. The equipping our old selves used to seek satisfaction were sexual immorality, impurity, passion, evil desire, and covetousness, which is idolatry. We need to get rid of those so that our new selves can be equipped to seek satisfaction through "compassionate hearts, kindness, humility, meekness, and patience." The tools our old selves used to respond to people failing us were "anger, wrath, malice, slander, and obscene talk from your mouth." The tools our new selves need to be equipped with are "bearing with one another and, if one has a complaint against another, forgiving each other; as the Lord has forgiven you, so you also must forgive." To use the new equipment, we need to learn to throw out the old.

Too often, we try to keep both sets of tools around. We want to keep anger in our back pocket just in case we don't want to forgive someone. We want to use obscene talk from our mouth when we don't feel like expressing kindness. Why bear with one another when we can spread malice and slander? The reality is that by keeping our old set of tools, we hinder our use of the new ones. As long as the old set of tools are a viable option, then we show our disdain for the tools with which God equips us. We need to throw out those old tools.

It's hard to throw out the old tools because we're so used to using them. But this month, I want to encourage us to actively identify what tools we've kept around from our old selves and to get rid of them. Pray that God would strengthen us to let go of the old tools and to practice using the new ones. This is God's expectation of us as we follow Him. This is how He wants us to serve Him.

At the Tuesday Bible study they watched a Louie Giglio video, "Winning the Battle of the Mind". Many of the men realized that the depressing thoughts they had about themselves were lies from Satan. The men started to understand that they are responsible for what they allow in their minds. Many see themselves as failures. They talked about not believing the lies Satan tells them.

Later in the week Harlan talked to a man about his fear of rejection. Harlan told him that God will not turn away anyone who wants to know Him. They talked about the Gospel and what it means to follow Jesus. When asked if he was ready to pray and ask Jesus into his life, the man tearfully prayed and trusted Jesus as his Saviour.
